Manuela García (1867–1931) was a Los Angeles singer who intimately knew nineteenth century Spanish-language songs. Between 1904 to 1905, Charles Lummis, with his interest in the Southwest, in the documentation of culture, recorded 300 Mexican folk songs on wax cylinders and later published them in his 1923 book, *Spanish Songs of Old California*. García recorded and sang from memory around 150 Spanish-language songs for Lummis' project. In addition to singing for Lummis, García gave him her notebook containing the words to 149 songs.
