### HOW DO I FIND LAPL Writes?

In-Library and Home (Remote Access with a valid LAPL Library card)

**LAPL Writes**, a relatively new feature, is available online at all LAPL locations and remotely from the **LAPL** website under *Collections & Resources* which opens (as shown below) when you hold your cursor over the category. Click on *LAPL Writes* to open the site.

Once any item is checked in Collections & Resources section, the contents of the whole section is displayed on the left side, allowing movement from one subject to another.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

The introduction to the site is the "Welcome message" that sums up the site and its purpose:

Welcome to LAPL Writes, our guide to the Los Angeles Public Library's many resources for our local author community. Take a look at what the Library has to offer and find useful advice on everything from overcoming writer's block to getting your work published.

#### **HOW TO BEGIN**:

The site is divided into five subject areas, select one that you would like to pursue and click on it:

- 1) **Book Lists** shows sample book, eBook and e-Audio book covers in six areas of writing such as *General Writing Advice*, *Screenwriting*, and *Editing & Publishing*. All items are in the Library catalog. If you click on the Click for a selected list under each area, more titles will be listed.
- 2) *Online Resources* contains online courses and databases with topics related to writing. You only need a valid library card to use the materials.

- 3) Library Journal SELF-e offers the opportunity to L.A. residents to become part of a public library eBook discover service. Partnering with the Library Journal, LAPL provides L.A.'s self-published authors the chance to submit their eBook for circulation, and readers to have access to new literary voices. All of the initial submission information and requirements are contained here.
- **4)** Submission Policy covers instructions and factors for selection on how a person who has written a book can submit the title for the Library's consideration.
- 5) *Events* announces upcoming Events related to the *Aloud lecture series* presented by the Library Foundation, *Author-related programs* at the Central or Branch Libraries, and *Writing Groups* that meet at the Libraries, or any *Other Literary Events*.

#### More Information about SELF-e: [All that is required is an engaging story and your eBook file.]

The **SELF-e** platform is free and available to the Library's patrons and local writing community. This section contains the initial submission steps and answers questions regarding the purpose and process when you --"click here" within the text. *FAQs* and *Getting Started* outline the Terms of Agreement and Submission requirements.

There are two free tools listed that can be used to convert files: *Online-Convert* and *2epub.com*. (Submissions must be in the epub or pdf file format.)

A form to submit any questions is included.

LAPL will feature the collection of self-published titles on the BiblioBoard platform.



#### Located under e-Media on the Home Page

BiblioBoard is a platform for libraries to license and deliver digital content - books, articles, images, photographs, maps, pamphlets, and documents as well as streaming audio and video content on a wide variety of topics including Literature, History, Philosophy, Religion, Science, Nature, Native American Studies, Sports, Drama, Games, Crafts, Cooking, Music and Children's Literature.

All content is available on an unlimited multi-user basis with no checkouts or returns. You can access BiblioBoard content from the web or various mobile devices using your library card number. Download the free app using these links: Web, iPad, Nexus, Kindle Fire HD Just choose "Los Angeles Public Library" from the Library Credentials drop down, then enter your library card # and pin.
