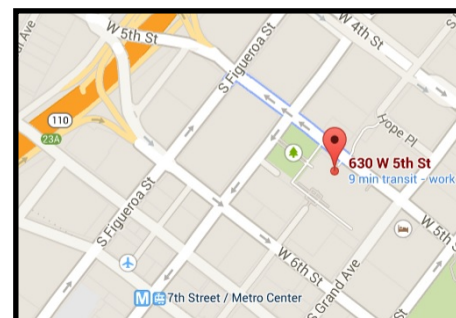
Parking: Parking at the Central Library will cost \$1.00 if participants arrive after 10AM and have a Los Angeles Public Library card. Guests may apply for a library car the same day. Guests who come before 10AM will be obligated to pay the parking structure's regular weekend rate.

Seating: There will be limited seating. Guests who are unable to participate in the information session and citizenship workshop due to capacity restrictions will be advised of a later opportunity.

Free Citizenship Application Workshop

Asian Americans Advancing Justice-Los Angeles will provide free assistance with filling out Form N-400, Application for Naturalization. The citizenship workshop will include:

- Check your eligibility for citizenship
- Complete your citizenship application
- Review of your application by an attorney
- File for a fee waiver, if you qualify
- Help you prepare for the interview
- Provide you with free study materials
- Free passport photos



Be sure to:

1. Make an appointment
2. Bring the \$680 USCIS filing/fingerprint fee if you do not qualify for the fee waiver (\$595 if 75 or older)

Advancing Justice-Los Angeles' services include:

1. Checking your eligibility for citizenship
2. Completing your citizenship application
3. Filing for fee waiver, if you qualify
4. Help you prepare for your interview
5. Review of your application by an immigration attorney
6. Free passport photos



Citizenship Eligibility Requirements:

- ✓ You are at least 18 years old
- ✓ You are a legal permanent resident (green card holder)
- ✓ You have continuously lived in the U.S. as a permanent resident for at least 5 years
 - or you are married to a U.S. citizen and have continuously lived in the U.S. for at least 3 years
 - or you received your green card as a survivor of abuse by your U.S. citizen
- ✓ You have been physically present in the U.S. for at least 2 ½ out of the past 5 years
 - or you are married to a U.S. citizen and have been physically present in the U.S. for at least 1 ½ years out of the past 3 years
- ✓ You can speak, read, and write simple English
 - or you are at least 55 years old and have been a permanent resident for at least 15 years
 - or you are at least 50 years old and have been a permanent resident for at least 20 years
 - or you have a disability that prevents you from learning English
- ✓ You know basic U.S. government and history
 - or you have a disability that prevents you from learning U.S. government and history
