"Bunker Hill By Leo Politi" Exhibit Celebrating Artist's Centennial Birthday on View at Central Library February 2 – June 14, 2008

Works by award-winning artist and illustrator Leo Politi, who frequently used Los Angeles images in his art, will be on display in the exhibit "Bunker Hill by Leo Politi" at the Central Library's First Floor Galleries, 630 W. Fifth St., downtown Los Angeles, from February 2 to June 14, 2008. The exhibit celebrates the centennial of Politi's birth.

The artwork depicts Politi's beloved Bunker Hill of old homes as they appeared at the turn of the century. Politi celebrated the neighborhood with his 1964 book "Bunker Hill, Los Angeles," followed by four more books over the next 25 years. The exhibition features paintings, gouaches and sketches from the Bunker Hill books.

Designed as a residential district at the turn of the 20th century, Bunker Hill remained an exclusive enclave until the end of World War I. After World War II and the opening of the Pasadena Freeway and the construction of other freeways, many people left downtown and the elegant Victorian mansions of Bunker Hill deteriorated into slums.

In 1955, the city began a massive revitalization effort of the neighborhood that cleared buildings and streetcar tunnels from the hill. When the city's building-height limit increased to 150 feet, some of the city's tallest skyscrapers were built on Bunker Hill and now feature prominently in downtown's skyline.

Politi, who died in 1996, is also recognized for his children's books, two of which were awarded Caldecott Honors: "Pedro, The Angel of Olvera Street" and "Juanita." In 1950, he won the Caldecott Medal for "Song of the Swallows."

"Bunker Hill by Leo Politi" is free and open to the public during library hours: Monday - Thursday: 10 a.m. - 8p.m.; Friday & Saturday: 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. and Sunday 1 - 5 p.m. The
