Pacoima Branch First Library to Offer San Fernando Valley Residents Loanable Laptops and iPad Minis from TechKiosk

LOS ANGELES (March 11, 2016) – The Pacoima Branch of the Los Angeles Public Library now offers free laptops and iPad Minis to use in the library, located at 12605 Van Nuys Blvd. in Pacoima. The TechKiosk is an automated self-service device that offers six Lenovo laptops and six iPad Minis.

Patrons select a device, scan their Los Angeles Public Library card and can use the laptop or iPad Mini anywhere in the Pacoima Branch for up to two hours. All devices feature cloud-based word processing and various Android mobile apps and are connected to the library's free Wi-Fi.
