Central Library Hosts School Choices Day for Parents

Los Angeles Unified School District and Area Charter Schools Offer a Wide Range of Options

LOS ANGELES (September 27, 2016) – Los Angeles Public Library will host its first School Choices Day, a free event for parents on Saturday, October 1. Families with elementary, middle school and high school aged students are invited to attend presentations by downtown area schools in Central Library's Taper Auditorium at 630 West 5th Street.

The schools offer students a wide range of choices for a free education, including several campuses that focus attention on a particular curriculum, ranging from the arts to science to business. School Choices Day will gather together more than 20 schools, grouping their presentations according to age level. Staff from the LAUSD Magnet Office will begin the event at 10:00 a.m. with an overview of the CHOICES application process.

At the conclusion of each panel, school representatives will be on hand at receptions to answer questions from parents.
