"Lunch at the Library" Serves Free School Lunches with a Helping of Fun to Kids during Summer Break

Popular program for children of low-income families expanded to 14 libraries and is served weekdays, June 13 – August 5

Los Angeles, CA – To ensure that students who receive free school lunches won't go hungry during the summer break, the Los Angeles Public Library, in partnership with the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, is serving free weekday lunches at 14 libraries from June 13 to August 5, 2016. The free lunches meet USDA nutrition guidelines, and are available to anyone age 18 or younger.

Along with a nutritious meal, the library offers engaging activities to participating children, such as crafts and puppet shows, as well as the opportunity to sign up for the Los Angeles Public Library "Read for the Win" Summer Reading Program, which runs concurrently with summer lunch.

This is the 4th year of serving summer lunch at the library. Last year, the library served more than 12,000 meals during the eight-week program. With new locations added, the goal is to serve an even larger number of meals to children in need. No documentation or enrollment of children is required.

"Hunger during summer break is an issue in several communities, and the Los Angeles Public Library's summer lunch program is reducing the nutritional gap faced by many children," said City Librarian John F. Szabo. "Studies have linked nutrition to cognitive abilities. Providing healthy lunches can help increase a child's ability to learn new skills and can improve performance in school."

The program is part of a statewide collaboration between the California Library Association and the California Summer Meal Coalition. The partnership between libraries and summer meal programs was cultivated in 2013, after California Food Policy

Advocates reported that in 2012 only 17% of children in California receiving a free/reduced-price lunch during the school year also participated in a summer meal program.
