Free Lunch for Kids at the Los Angeles Public Library

LAPL to offer "Lunch at the Library" to children and teens at 14 locations every weekday this summer from June 12 – August 4

Los Angeles, June 9, 2017 – With summer break upon us for students across Los Angeles, the Los Angeles Public Library and the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank are once again teaming up to help feed hungry children and teens. From June 12 until August 4, the library will help serve free meals to children and teens every weekday at 14 locations across the city, including at the iconic Central Library in downtown Los Angeles.

This is the fifth year of the library serving summer lunches across Los Angeles. Last year, nearly 16,000 meals were served as part of Lunch at the Library, an increase of more than 3,000 meals from 2015. Since Lunch at the Library began in 2013, the library has served more than 40,000 meals to children and teenagers who otherwise may go without during the summer while expanding from hosting the program at two locations in 2013 to 14 this year.

Along with its summer lunches, libraries will also host more than 1,400 programs across the city this summer. Patrons are also invited to participate in the library's annual Summer Reading Challenge. Titled "Reading by Design", the program invites all LAPL patrons to expand their senses of imagination, learning, exploration, and creativity through reading.

Just as summer lunch programs help feed students who otherwise could go hungry without assistance over their summer breaks from school, summer reading programs like the Summer Reading Challenge, and the programs that take place in conjunction with it, help stem learning loss for students over the summer break. Students who read during the summer sharpen their reading skills and often perform better when they return to the classroom in the fall.
