Los Angeles (August 2, 2021) – The Los Angeles Public Library will fully restore weekday and weekend hours beginning Monday, August 2, 2021. This returns the hours of operation to the pre-pandemic schedule and is the latest phase of the library's ongoing reopening following the closure of all libraries last year due to COVID-19.

The library will continue to offer select services at 70 locations across the city that include quick browsing, computer access, pick-up of holds and mobile printing orders and checking out of materials inside libraries.
