## The Los Angeles Public Library Announces the Reopening of its Remaining Libraries on June 21 as the Latest Stage in its Phased Reopening Efforts

Los Angeles (June 17, 2021) — The Los Angeles Public Library announces the reopening of 20 additional branch library locations on June 21 as the latest step in its phased reopening process. The reopenings will bring the total number of libraries open across the city to 70 locations. The three remaining locations in the system of 73 libraries will remain closed for maintenance.

The 70 libraries will offer select services that may include quick browsing, computer access, pick-up of holds and mobile printing orders and checking out of materials inside libraries. At the locations offering the Library to Go outside pick-up service, patrons will now collect their materials inside the libraries. For the continued health and safety of staff and the public, masks must be worn at all libraries.

This is the latest phase of the library's reopening efforts to gradually restore library services following the closure of all libraries last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
